Dear Sisters and Brothers of the Hicksville Congress of Teachers,

Our shared purpose is exceedingly more pressing than any trivial differences we may have with one another. My purpose is larger than me; it's greater than we are on our own. Our differences pale in comparison. We are far more alike than we are different. We are stronger together.

As this new school year moves into mid-September and we settle into our routines, concerns will arise and some will be assuaged, and adjustments will be necessary. We will meet issues head on and take the best course of action for the greater good of our members. That is unionism.

For our newest members these are staples of a new year, part of the learning curve. To those veterans, it is not a revelation. However, unlike in years past, we face a greater unknown on the horizon. The future of the profession now more than ever, is opaque. Forces are at work to 'muddy the waters' with regards to all we have come to know and expect from the fields of public education and unionism. Contrary to what some may believe, the sky may indeed be falling. The aforementioned purpose we share is remaining strong by remaining united.

The first of the bifurcated attacks occurs in roughly fifty-five days. On **Election Day, November 7th, 2017**, as you no doubt know by now, New Yorkers will be asked a simple ballot question at the polls:

"Shall there be a convention to revise the constitution and amend the same?" If we value collective bargaining rights, pensions, public education, protecting the environment, the social safety net providing for citizens in need, and voting rights, to name a few, then the answer must be a **resounding** "NO". If NYSUT's 600,000 plus members engage their

families, friends and neighbors, make a plan to get to the polls and execute it by exercising their right, I believe we can stave off the first attack.

The ominous threat looming beyond that is more troublesome. In what is a case sure to be taken up by the **U.S. Supreme Court, Janus vs. AFSCME** could potentially have deleterious results for the working middle-class in this country. By essentially gutting collective bargaining rights, this case has far-reaching, nationwide implications to more than just unionized workers. To gain a better understanding of the potential, one need look no further than 2011 when Wisconsin Governor Scott Walker knee-capped collective bargaining rights in his state. A search of the country's "**Right-To-Work"** states will show the disparity in pay, benefits, health care quality, and working conditions versus their unionized counterparts.

My "ask" for all of you is to stay alert, stay informed, stay engaged, and be ready to act at a moment's notice...the profession may just depend upon it.

Tell Congress to preserve DACA and pass the Dream Act

On September 5, President Trump announced that the **Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA)** program will end in six months unless Congress preserves it. As many as **800,000 young people could be deported**, including many students and educators. Known as Dreamers, they came to the United States as children and know no other country as home. The decision to end DACA sparked protests all across America.



"We will continue to raise our voices in a collective chorus for justice to defend and protect Dreamers and their families. Now more than ever, we need a <u>permanent legislative solution</u> to DACA so these young people can have the certainty they deserve. Congress should not wait six months to permanently fix this decision but instead act immediately to protect DACA recipients and Dreamers, and pass into law the bipartisan Dream Act of 2017," said NEA president Lily Eskelsen García.take action

The Dream Act of 2017 (S. 1615/H.R. 3440) grants legal status and establishes a path to citizenship for undocumented immigrants brought to the United States as children; it also provides a long-term legislative solution for the DACA program. District-wide Professional Development Committee - Meets three times per year to discuss and develop staff development.

Building Level Site Based - Monthly meetings. Team includes principal, teacher(s), parents and students. Teacher member(s) represent the HCT and must meet regularly with HCT building reps and faculty to solicit input

to bring to the team. Only Tenured Teachers.

District Wide Site Based - Meets 4 to 5 times annually with District team including Central Office Administrators, Building Administration, teacher(s) and parents. Members represent the HCT and must communicate with HCT executive officers regarding issues at district level.

Building Health & Safety Committee - For building(s) that do not include this as part of Site Based team. Monthly meetings with principal and teacher(s) to discuss issues of concern. Teacher member(s) represent the HCT and must communicate regularly with HCT building reps and faculty to solicit input to bring to the team.

Political Action/VOTE-COPE Committee - Provide support to membership, acquainting them with opportunities to strengthen our position as stake holders in the political process and to assist with the annual VOTE-COPE drive.

Scholarship Committee - To review HCT scholarship criteria and candidates. Selects recipients for submission to the HCT.
